






March 2000 - The Little Conestoga

 March 2001 - LCWA volunteers help Lancaster Township with Maple Grove stream restoration & forest buffer project with assistance from Rettew Associates










Maple Grove Buffer Project




- May 2001 LCWA volunteers cleanup ½ mile section of the Little Conestoga Creek behind Park City Mall




